



Speech of H.E. Dr. Saleh Al-Nabit, President of Planning and Statistics Authority

At the Opening of Doha Data Forum for Inclusive Data Ecosystems and Effective Decision Making

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Representatives of ministries, government agencies, the private sector, universities, research centers and civil society organizations,

Our guests and partners, representative of the UN organizations, regional organizations, and Arab and international statistical agencies,

First of all, I would like to welcome you to the opening of the "Doha Data Forum for Inclusive Data Ecosystems and Effective Decision Making" organized by the Planning and Statistics Authority under the auspices of H.E. Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim Al-Thani, Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Thus, we must support the digital transformation in Qatar by providing the National Statistical System (NSS) with comprehensive, accurate and reliable data that meets the needs of different beneficiaries, while enabling the country to fulfill its commitments towards achieving national development goals and supporting the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, as well as other international commitments.

Ladies and gentlemen,

The official statistics produced by PSA, in collaboration with partners, are a pillar of national knowledge; the basis for evidence-based and credible policies; the foundation of the objective accountability and international benchmarking, and a reliable source of information that enables us to measure the progress towards our development goals.

From this standpoint, our interest in organizing this forum is exceptional, since it is an intellectual platform that brings together a group of experts and specialists in the field of statistics and data science. We, undoubtedly, consider this an opportunity for us to think about ways to address emerging challenges and issues as per innovative solutions, away from stereotypes and rigidities.

The official data and statistics are considered a precious national wealth of strategic value, as they constitute one of the most important elements of the infrastructure upon which the planning and decision-making processes at the institutional and national levels are based. This would support the Qatar National Vision 2030, which emphasizes the importance of preserving development gains for current and future generations.

Hence, we look forward to strengthening cooperation and establishing constructive partnerships with stakeholders to support, enhance access to, and sustainably develop the national data system, with special attention to the issue of capacity building, while benefiting from successful models in decision-making based on official statistics in accordance with the recommendations of the United Nations Statistical Commission, and the Cape Town Declaration published by the first UN World Data Forum in 2017.
