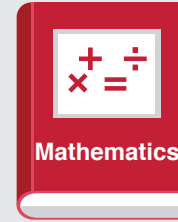

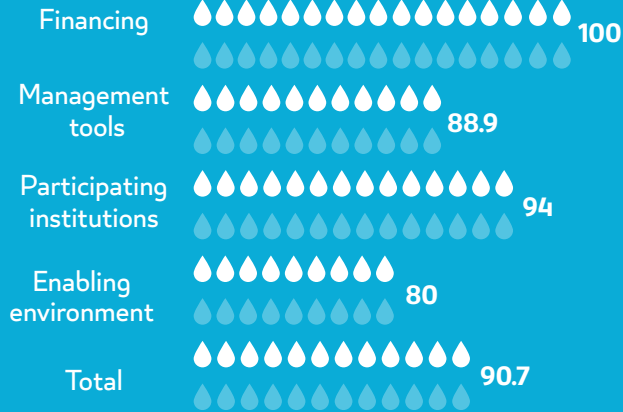


Level of water stress %

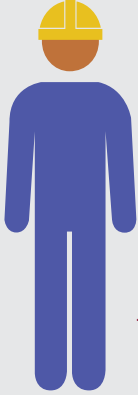

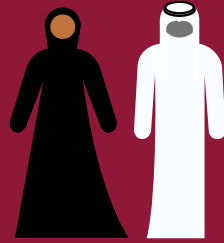

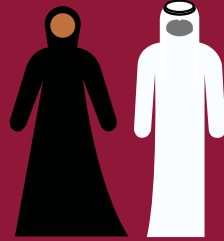

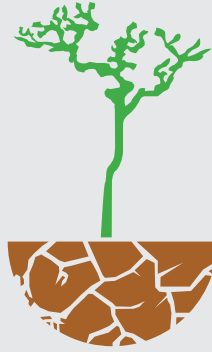

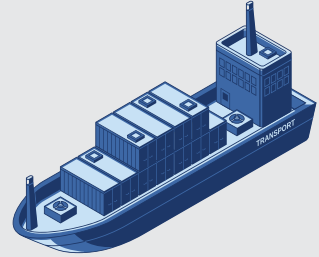

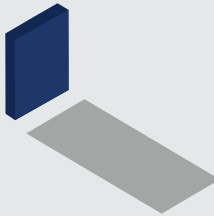
